- Hike leaders and members who exhibit symptoms of the Covid-19 virus (fever, dry cough, shortness of breath), flu-like symptoms, common cold, bronchitis or any other contagious illness should stay home until you do not have symptoms! Hike leaders please follow protocol for cancelling a hike.
- 2) Hikers will still sign the sign up sheet, but should bring and use their own sanitizer if they feel the need after sharing the pen and clipboard.
- **3**) Please keep the suggested distance (approximately 6-foot) between you and your fellow hikers while circling up and hiking.
- **4)** Refrain from physical contact with one another including shaking hands, fist bumping, hugging etc...
- 5) Cover your cough/sneeze and sanitize frequently.
- 6) Be mindful of your personal health situation and do what is best for you after discussing it with your health care provider.
